Maria Sharapova, born on April 19, 1987, in Nyagan, Russia, emerged as one of the most iconic figures in the world of tennis. At the tender age of four, she began playing tennis under the guidance of her father, Yuri Sharapova, in Sochi, Russia. Recognising her prodigious talent, Sharapova moved with her father to the United States at the age of seven to pursue her tennis dreams. Despite facing challenges due to language barriers and financial constraints, she quickly rose through the ranks of junior tennis, capturing the attention of coaches and scouts with her powerful serve and fierce determination.

In 2004, at the age of 17, Sharapova achieved a remarkable milestone by winning her first Grand Slam title at Wimbledon, defeating Serena Williams in the final.
