for identifying maximum parts
of the Human Body in a span of
1 minute and 49 seconds.**



From her infant days, Meenakshi was fascinated with Space, Dinosaurs, and Marine Creatures. She first saw them through her book collections (NGC – Little Kids First Big Book series) and asked her parents to explain the contents to her.

At the age of two, she started identifying and spelling the alphabets A-Z and Numerals 1 - 10 as well as trying to name the Animals, Birds, Vehicles, etc.,

By the age of Three, she began pronouncing the Dinosaur's names as well as talking about Space (from Milky Way Galaxy to Chandryan to launch process).

In this current pandemic time, Meenakshi had to spend much of her time at home watching YouTube and reading few books, as her parents were busy with their own work and had limited time to spend with her.

Apart from this, she showed interest in Singing (Western Cinematic) & rehearsing short orations. Last year she won a couple of Global online competitions in those segments.

In recent times, she started watching animated series on Human Body in YouTube and began to use those medical terms while playing with her toy dolls, thus it struck to her parents that she can pronounce those words perfectly. Then they organized the Human body in order and asked her to explain the parts, which she identified around 50 to their surprise.

Her parents decided to encourage her talent to the next level, hence registered it as a feat for her age segment titled – “Child identifying 60 plus Human Body Parts under 2 Min”.

Her parents initially tried to register with the Guinness Book of World records but were unable to do so. Thus, they sent the application to “India Book of Records” where the title was accepted. They shot & sent a video, where Meenakshi successfully identified 65 Human Body parts in under two minutes and later getting the feat registered as a record.

India Book of Records acknowledged her feat with a Certificate & Medal.
