'Children of today will make the India of tomorrow. The way we bring them up determines the future of our country.'

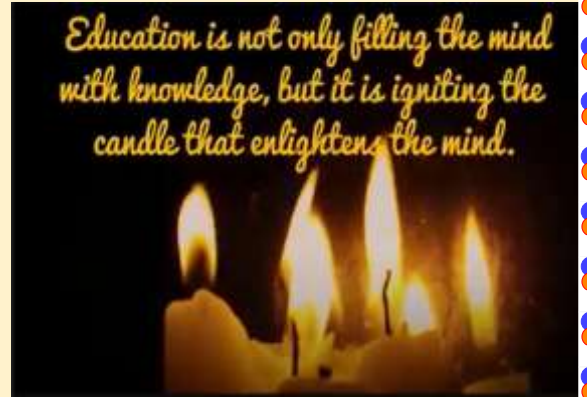
