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A root word stands on its own as a word but you can make new words from it by adding beginnings (Prefixes) and endings (Suffixes).

For example, 'comfort' is a root word. By adding the Prefix 'dis' and the Suffix 'able' you can make new words such as 'discomfort' and 'comfortable'.

#### PREFIX:

A Prefix is a letter or a group of letters that is added at the beginning of the root word to form a new word.

- A Prefix does not have any meaning of its own but when added to a root word it modifies the meaning of the word.
- Prefix makes a word negative, indicates opinion or shows repetition.

### **Examples:**

- un (Prefix) + happy (Root Word) = unhappy (new word)
- dis (Prefix) + organized (Root word) = disorganized (new word)

#### A SHORT LIST OF PREFIXES:

Prefix	Meaning	Examples
mis -	wrong	mistake, misbehave
dis -	not, opposite of	disappear, disqualify
il -	not	illogical, illegal
im -	not, without	impossible, improper
in -	not, without	inactive, invisible
un -	against, not, opposite	undo, unequal

Suffix	Meaning	Examples
- ish	having the quality of	childish, selfish
- ness	denoting a state or condition	kindness, happiness
- less	without, not effected by	careless, meaningless
- ible	usually able to be, capable of	responsible, destructible
- er	person or object that does a specified action, comparatives	worker, dancer
- ment	the act, state or result of an action	enjoyment, development
