Biographical Sketch means an account of the life and activities of an individual or family. It would include information about the person's name, place of residence, education, occupation, life and activities and other important details. Biographical sketches include a lot of interesting facts about the person. Biographical sketch also tells about hobbies, interests, friends, influences in the life of that person and about his accomplishments.



A biographical sketch is always written by someone else except the person on whom it is written.



The main points that need to be incorporated while writing a Bio-Sketch are:

- Full name, date of birth/age, place of birth
- Major personality traits
- Educational details highlighting any major achievements or awards
- His/ Her contribution to society
- Any special interest
- Why is he/she famous or known for?

How to Write a Biographical Sketch:

- All the information should be in chronological order while writing.
- Always written in the third person and in past tense.
- Heading/Title should be underlined. (**Biographical Sketch** of......)
- A biographical sketch is always written in one paragraph.
- No clues should be left out.
- No additional information should be included.

Mahatma Gandhi

-entered politics, wanted to free India from

the unjust British rule.

15 Aug.1947 -won freedom for India

30 Jan 1948 -shot dead.

Biographical Sketch of Mahatma Gandhi

Mahatma Gandhi whose full name was Mohandas Karamchand Gandhi was born on 2nd October at Porbandar. After his school education, he went to England to study Law. In 1893, he went to South Africa to start his legal practice. Seeing the miserable condition of the Indians living in South Africa, for twenty long years he fought a long battle for the rights of Indians in Africa. On coming back to India in 1919, he entered politics. His object was to free India from the unjust British rule. It was mainly because of him that India on 15th August 1947 won freedom. This great son of Mother India was shot dead on 30th January, 1948.
