### **Consonant Sounds**

In the French language, most of the final consonants are not pronounced except for final **c**, **f**, and **r**.

<b>French Letters</b>	<b>English Sounds</b>	<b>Examples</b>
<b>c</b> (before e, i, y)	s	ce, cinéma, Nancy
<b>ca</b> (before a, o, u)	s	ça, garçon
<b>c</b> (before a, o, u)	k	carotte, comme
<b>ch</b>	sh	chez, Michel
<b>j, g</b> (before e, i, y)	similar to zh	juge, nageons, je, Jim
<b>g</b> (before a, o)	hard g	gant, gomme
<b>h</b> (silent) at the beginning of word	word begins with the sound of the vowel	hôtel
<b>h</b> (aspirate) at the beginning or in the middle of the word	far less aspirated than in English	haine, cahier
