	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Often these persons become more widely recognised because they have the support of large number of people who have united to address a particular issue of inequality.• In India there are several struggles in which people have come together to fight for issues that they believe are important.
14	<p>How do Tawa Matsya Sangh helped the people after their struggle?</p> <p>With the TMS taking over the fish workers were able to increase their earnings substantially. This was because;</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• They set up the cooperative which would buy the catch from them at a fair price.• The cooperative would then arrange to transport and sell this in markets where they would get a good price.• They have now begun to earn three times more than they earned earlier.• The TMS has also begun giving the fish workers loans for repair and the buying of new nets.• By managing to earn a higher wage as well as preserving the fish in the reservoir, the TMS has shown that when people's organisations get their rights to livelihood, they can be good managers.
