Do Not contain a subject and a predicate	Do contain a subject and a predicate	
Cannot convey a complete thought	Can sometimes convey a complete thought	
Cannot stand alone	Independent clauses can stand alone	
EX: was working	EX: He went to school	

Examples:

- 1. Opening the gate, Jose let his dog into the yard. (PHRASE)
- 2. It is too bad that Ms. Fraser will not be teaching next year. (CLAUSE)
- 3. The player who hits the winning run will be the MVP for the game. (CLAUSE)
- 4. After listening to the students, Mr. Johnson changed his mind about the assignment. (PHRASE)

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A dependent clause alone cannot form a complete sentence.	
The subordinators do the work of connecting the dependent clause to another clause to complete the sentence. In each of the dependent clause, the first word is a subordinator. Subordinators include relative pronouns, subordinating conjunctions, and noun clause markers.	In a sentence two independent clauses can be connected by the coordinators: and, but, so, or, nor, for, yet.
