A story is a work of fiction or imagination that is usually written in easily understandable grammatical structure with natural flow of speech.


Points to remember while writing a story:

- Give a suitable title and it should be as short as possible.
- Narration of events should be in chronological order with a clear beginning, middle and end.
- Introduce meaningful monologue, dialogue or conversation (at least 3) in the story.
- Use simple language and 'Past tense'.

There are five main elements that apply to stories in general:

- 1. **Character**: The **protagonist** is the main character in a story. The **antagonist** is the character that opposes the main character.
- 2. **Setting**: The time and place of the story
- 3. **Conflict**: Struggle between the main character and an opposing force. A problem in the story that has to be resolved.
- 4. **Plot:** The sequence of events where each affects the next one through the principle of cause-and-effect.
- 5. **Theme:** The moral or message of the story

These are also the main "ingredients in a story", apart from the title and the dialogues that add spice to a story!



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Format of the Story:

<u>TITLE</u> – (to be underlined) SPACE Paragraph 1: The Introduction or the beginning of the story SPACE Paragraph 2: Incidents and events explained in detail SPACE Paragraph 3: Conclusion / Ending SPACE Moral/Words of Wisdom/Quote

Sample Story:

Question: It was raining heavily; the street lights had gone off and I was returning.....
