DEGREES OF COMPARISON




Hi!

Degrees of Comparison are used when we compare one person or one thing with another. In Degrees of Comparison, adjectives change their form when they show comparison.

Lee is tall.








Here the adjective *tall* changes its form to show comparison.

Positive Degree



When we speak about only one person or thing, we use the **Positive degree.**

Example:





✓ This flower is beautiful.



* Each sentence mentioned above talks about only one noun.

Comparative Degree

When we compare two persons or two things with each other, We use **Comparative degree.**

Example:

- ✓ This house is <u>bigger than</u> that one.
- \checkmark This flower is <u>more beautiful than</u> that.







* Each sentence mentioned above compares two things.



Superlative Degree

I'm the funniest



When we compare more than two persons or things with one another, we use **Superlative degree**.

Example:



- ✓ This is the biggest house in this street.
- ✓ This is the <u>most beautiful</u> flower in this garden.
