### DEGREES OF COMPARISON



**Hi!**  
**I am Adjective, coming from Parts of Speech.**  
**I am used to describe or modify nouns or pronouns.**

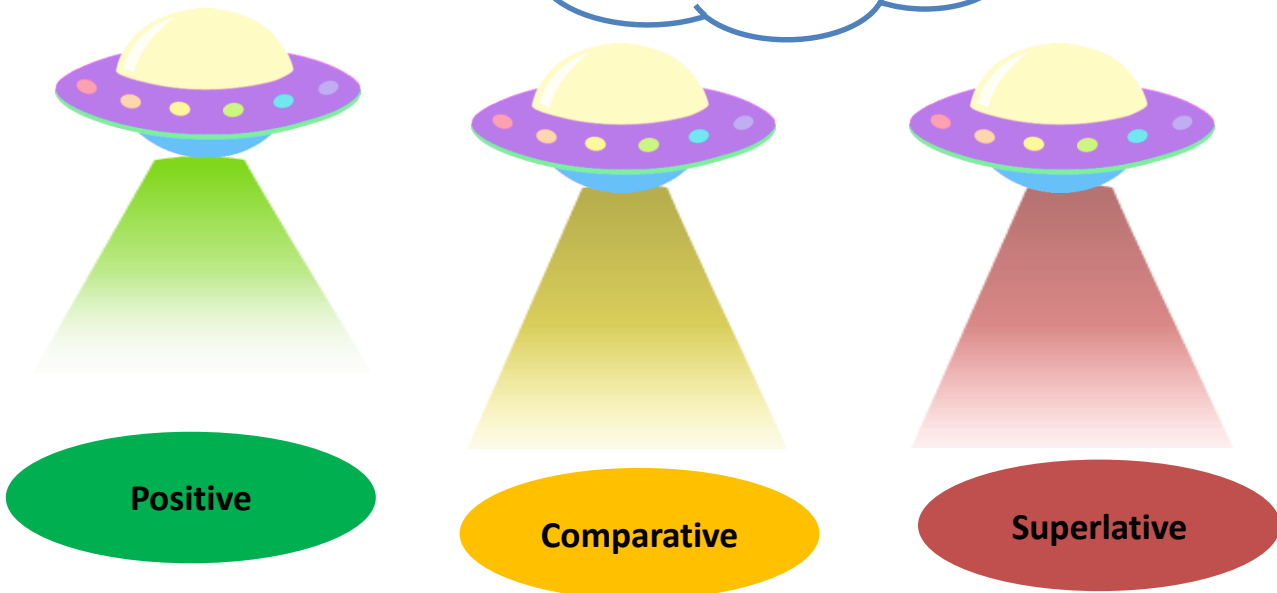
**Degrees of Comparison** are used when we compare one person or one thing with another.  
In Degrees of Comparison, adjectives change their form when they show comparison.

**Degrees of Comparison are applicable only to Adjectives/ Adverbs.**

**\*Nouns and verbs do not have degrees of comparisons\***



**Hi!**  
**I have 3 different forms.**  
**Let's look at them one by one.**



Chang is *the tallest*.

Ming is *taller than Lee*.

Lee is *tall*.



Here the adjective ***tall*** changes its form to show comparison.

## Positive Degree

I'm **funny**

When we speak about only one person or thing, we use the **Positive degree**.

**Example:**

✓ This house is big.



✓ This flower is beautiful.



**\* Each sentence mentioned above talks about only one noun.**

## Comparative Degree

When we compare two persons or two things with each other, We use **Comparative degree**.

**Example:**

✓ This house is bigger than that one.



✓ This flower is more beautiful than that.



I'm **funnier**  
than you



**\* Each sentence mentioned above compares two things.**

# Superlative Degree

I'm the funniest



When we compare more than two persons or things with one another, we use **Superlative degree**.

**Example:**

✓ This is the biggest house in this street.



✓ This is the most beautiful flower in this garden.

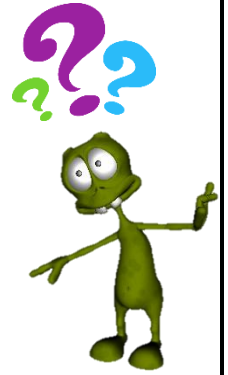
