Countable Nouns

- ✓ They are nouns that can be counted.
- \checkmark They have singular and plural forms.
- ✓ The articles 'a' or 'an' can be used for singular countable nouns.




3 candles



8 bottles



a cake



an egg

Uncountable Nouns

- ✓ They are nouns that **cannot be** counted.
- ✓ We do not use the article 'a' or 'an' with them.
- ✓ We use quantifiers like some, little or much before them.
- ✓ For example: a little salt, some juice, or much food.
- ✓ They do not have a plural form.









milk

honey

juice

salt

Note:

We can use **measure words** or **counters** to quantify Uncountable Nouns. For example:

- <u>a glass</u> of water
- a bowl of soup
- a pinch of salt
- a slice of bread
