There are four genders of noun in English language. They are Masculine Gender, Feminine Gender, Common Gender and Neuter Gender.

1. **Masculine Gender** - A noun that indicates a male is said to be of Masculine Gender.

**Eg:** boy, horse, shepherd, tiger, etc.

2. **Feminine Gender** – A noun that indicates a female is said to be of Feminine Gender.

**Eg:** girl, mare, shepherdess, tigress, etc.

3. **Common Gender** – A noun that denotes either a female or a male is said to be of Common Gender.

**Eg:** teacher, student, baby, children, doctor, etc.

4. **Neuter Gender** – A noun that denotes a non-living thing is said to be of Neuter Gender.

**Eg:** table, book, fan, pouch, etc.
