Subject – Verb Agreement refers to the relationship between the subject and its verb.

Points to remember:

A verb must agree with its subject in number and person.

A singular subject (he, she, it) takes a singular verb.
 We add 's/es' to the main verb to form the present tense.
 E.g. The dog <u>barks</u>.

A plural subject (**you, we, they**) takes a plural verb. We do not add '**s/es**' to the main verb to form the present tense. E.g. The dogs **bark**.

Verbs do not form their plural with an 's' like nouns.

To determine which verb is **singular** or **plural**, think which verb you would use with *he/she* and which verb you would use with *they*.

- 2. 'am' is the only verb that is used with the pronoun I.
- 3. The verb is plural if two or more singular subjects are joined by **and**.
 - E.g. Rahul and Sachin **are** playing cricket.

- Countable nouns- singular /plural take their verbs accordingly.
 E.g. The <u>goods</u> have been delivered on time.
 The desk was damaged.
- 5. Uncountable nouns take a singular verb.
 E.g. The <u>information</u> **was** given to the students.

 <u>Honesty</u> **is** the best policy.
- 6. Collective nouns take singular verbs
 E.g. My **family** is settled in Muscat.
 The **class** is making a lot of noise.
 When emphasizing individual members of a group, then the collective noun takes a plural verb.

E.g. The staff members were given a monthly bonus.

Note: 'You' which is used as a singular and plural subject always takes plural verb.
