TENSES

Verbs are words which denote an action. Depending upon the **time** when the action takes place (past, present or future), the verb takes on various forms which is known as the **tense** of the verb.



Types	Structure	Examples
Simple Present Tense	S + V1 (s/es for third- person)	We walk two miles every day.
Present Continuous Tense	S + am/is/are + verb-ing	He is driving the car too fast.
Present Perfect Tense	S + have/has + V3	She has cooked dinner.
Present Perfect Continuous Tense	S + have/has + been + verb-ing	The phone has been ringing for five minutes.
Simple Past Tense	S+ V2	The train arrived late by an hour.
Past Continuous Tense	S + was/were + verb-ing	She was studying all night.
Past Perfect Tense	S + had + V3	I had learnt swimming in my childhood.
Past Perfect Continuous Tense	S+ had + been + verb-ing	She had been studying before the exam.

Simple Future Tense	S+ will + V1	They will go to the park in the evening.
Future Continuous Tense	S + will be + verb-ing	They will be traveling to Paris next week.
Future Perfect Tense	S + will have + V3	I will have finished the book by tomorrow.
Future Perfect continuous Tense	S + will have been + verb-ing	I will have been studying for three hours by 6 p.m.
