	• MANAGING THE BUSINESS: An entrepreneur plans the future of his or her business.
	He/she arranges for raw material, hires people for work and tells everyone what to do. They also
	check if the plan is being followed.
	• DIVIDE INCOME: The entrepreneur divides the business money to many groups. He/she
	spends money to buy material, pays rent of the building and salaries to people.
	• TAKING RISK: Risk is the chance of something going wrong. An entrepreneur takes risks against fires, lost items and theft.
	• CREATE A NEW METHOD, IDEA OR PRODUCT: An entrepreneur is always trying new
	things. He/she does this to increase their importance and income.
