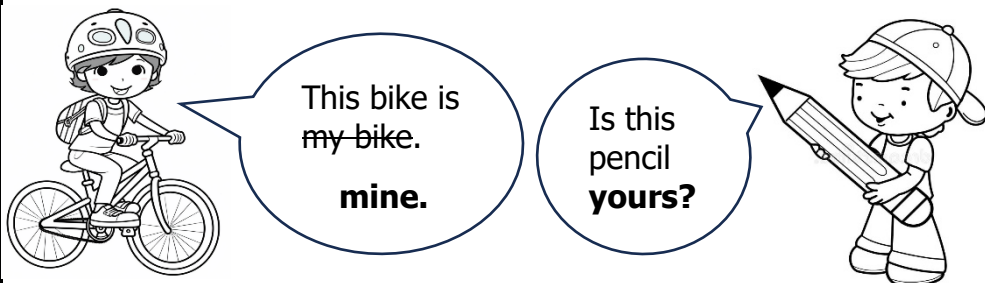

A **pronoun** is a word that takes the place of a noun. They make sentences shorter and easier to say.

You can use **Possessive Pronouns** to say who something belongs to. They take the place of the noun so you don't have to repeat it.



- Possessive Pronouns do not come with an apostrophe.
- Possessive pronouns stand alone. They do not come before a noun.
Eg: That book is her book. That book is **hers**.

I	mine	That pencil is mine .
you	yours	Is this water bottle yours ?
he	his	That school bag is his .
she	hers	The red dress is hers .
it	x	x
we	ours	This playground is ours .
they	theirs	The toys are theirs .

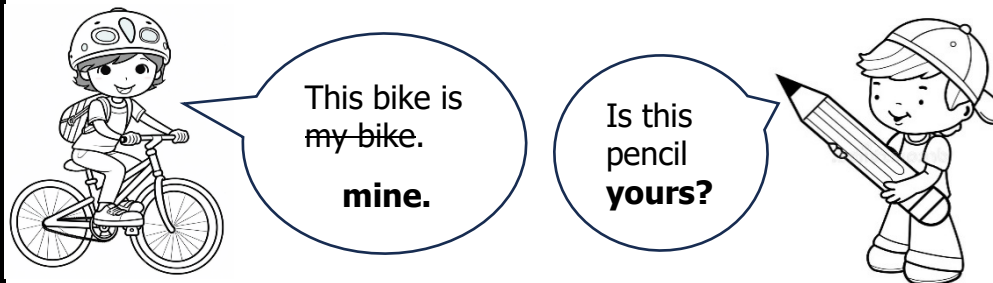
