DESCRIPTIVE PARAGRAPH

A descriptive paragraph is a type of writing that creates a vivid picture in the reader's mind by using sensory details like sight, sound, smell, taste, and touch. It focuses on specific features and characteristics of a person, place, object, or event, helping readers to visualize and connect with the subject more deeply.

Key Elements of Description

- Precise vocabulary and vivid adjectives
- Figurative language (similes, metaphors)
- Organized structure (spatial or order of importance)
- Clear focus on a single subject
- Specific details that paint a complete picture
- **Using Sensory Details**
 - Sight: The old leather book's worn edges and golden embossed title
 - Sound: The gentle rustle of pages turning
 - Touch: The smooth, cool surface of the marble statue
 - Smell: The fresh pine scent of new furniture
 - Taste: The sweet tang of a fresh orange
 - (wherever applicable)

Points to be kept in Mind

- It should give complete details about the person or thing being described in it.
- One should use simple language and short sentences in writing the paragraph.
- The word limit of 100 words should be strictly adhered to.
- The visual and verbal clues given in the question can be used in constructing the descriptive paragraph.
- It should not include the opinion of the writer, personal comments or recommendations about the person, place or event being described in the paragraph

Describing a Person

- Begin with striking physical features
- Include personality traits through actions
- Describe mannerisms and habits
- Use specific examples of behaviour
- Include relevant personal history
- Incorporate meaningful details

Describing Objects

- Start with overall appearance
- Focus on unique characteristics
- Include historical or personal significance
- Describe functionality
- Use precise measurements when relevant
- Add emotional connection if applicable

Describing a Place

- Name the place clearly
- Include details on the nearest airport, railway station, and road connectivity
- Use sensory details
- Focus on natural beauty, landmarks, and specific facilities like boating or trekking.
- Describe the "vibe" (e.g., the amalgamation of tradition and modernity in Delhi)
- Maintain logical flow
- Add your own feelings or experiences to make the description more engaging.
- End with a concluding impression

Describing Events

- **Tense:** Always use the **past tense**, as the event has already been completed.
- **Factual Sequence:** Include details from start to finish—who, what, where, and when.
- Start with the setting: Where and when did the event happen?
- Describe the atmosphere: What was the mood or feeling?
- Highlight key moments: Focus on one or two important details that made the event memorable.
- Conclude with reflection: End with how you felt or why the event mattered.

Sample Paragraphs

Include key milestones in his career, such as notable tournament wins and his performance in international competitions. Talk about his achievements in Chess Olympiads, rapid, and blitz formats.
 - **Style and Strengths:**
Discuss his playing style and strategies, known for his aggressive and tactical approach. Mention any notable games or victories that have made him stand out.
