Noun Number – Noun number refers to the count of a Noun.

A noun standing for one person, place, animal or thing is called a **Singular Noun**.

Examples: a pen, a river, a butterfly, a star, a man.

A noun standing for more than one person, place, animal or thing is called a **Plural Noun**.

Examples: pens, rivers, butterflies, stars, men.

RULES FOR FORMING PLURAL NOUNS

Rule 1: Add -s to most Nouns

Singular	Plural	Singular	Plural
student	students	park	parks
table	tables	pencil	pencils
garden	gardens	clock	clocks
doctor	doctors	friend	friends
letter	letters	camel	camels
stadium	stadiums	train	trains

Rule 2: Nouns ending in -ch, -sh, -ss, -s, or -x add - es

Singular	Plural	Singular	Plural
watch	watches	bus	buses
brush	brushes	box	boxes
dish	dishes	fox	foxes
branch	branches	class	classes
dress	dresses	torch	torches
witch	witches	sandwich	sandwiches

Exceptions: ox – oxen

Rule 3: Nouns ending in -o, add -es

Singular	Plural	Singular	Plural
tomato	tomatoes	hero	heroes
zero	zeroes	mosquito	mosquitoes
mango	mangoes	volcano	volcanoes
flamingo	flamingoes	buffalo	buffaloes

Exceptions: photo – photos, piano – pianos, video – videos, radio – radios, kangaroo – kangaroos, zoo – zoos, kilo - kilos

Rule 4(a): Nouns ending in Consonant + y, change -y to -ies

Singular	Plural	Singular	Plural
story	stories	baby	babies
fairy	fairies	cherry	cherries
city	cities	puppy	puppies
country	countries	lady	ladies
trophy	trophies	library	libraries
factory	factories	lily	lilies

Rule 4(b): Noui	ns ending in Vo	owel + y, add s
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Singular	Plural	Singular	Plural
runway	runways	ray	rays
monkey	monkeys	chimney	chimneys
tray	trays	jersey	jerseys
valley	valleys	trolley	trolleys

Rule 5: Nouns ending in -f or – fe change -f or -fe to -ves

Singular	Plural	Singular	Plural
leaf	leaves	knife	knives
wolf	wolves	loaf	loaves
shelf	shelves	calf	calves
thief	thieves	half	halves
bookshelf	bookshelves	wife	wives

Exceptions: roof-roofs, chef-chefs, chief - chiefs, café-cafes

Rule: 6 Irregular Plural: Some Nouns do not follow any specific rules while changing in number. Few change the inside vowels.

Singular	Plural	Singular	Plural
child	children	foot	feet
man	men	tooth	teeth
woman	women	goose	geese
mouse	mice	person	people

Rule: 7 Some Nouns don't change at all when they change to Plural.

Singular	Plural	Singular	Plural
sheep	sheep	deer	deer
furniture	furniture	money	money
water	water	salmon	salmon
bison	bison	aircraft	aircraft
