Apostrophe

- You can use an Apostrophe to show the possession/ownership.
- Add an apostrophe and 's' ('s) to a noun to show possession.
Eg. John's book is missing.
- If the noun already ends in 's', then you need to add only an Apostrophe (').
Eg. Agnes' gown was stitched by her mom.
