A' and 'an' are Articles which are used to denote one person, place, animal or thing.

- The Article 'a' is used before a noun or an adjective beginning with a consonant sound.
- The letters, b, c, d, f are some of the consonants in the English alphabet.
- E.g.- There is a table in my room.
 - We need to wear a uniform to school. (The letter 'u' of the uniform has a consonant sound.)
 - The Article 'an' is used before a noun or an adjective beginning with a vowel sound.
 - The letters a, e, i, o and u are vowels in the English alphabet.
- E.g.- I ate an egg and an apple for breakfast.

Amy is an honest girl. (The letter 'h' of honest is silent, so the word 'honest' starts with a vowel sound.) The Article 'the' is used -

before things that are unique or one of its kind.

E.g. the Mercury, the Earth, etc.

• before the names of oceans, seas, rivers, mountains etc.

E.g. the Arabian Sea, the Himalayas etc.

 before the names of holy books, magazines, books, and newspapers.

E.g. the Bible, the Observer, etc.

• to show a specific person or a thing.

E.g. The fan is red in colour.

The man is tall and handsome.
