PARAGRAPH WRITING

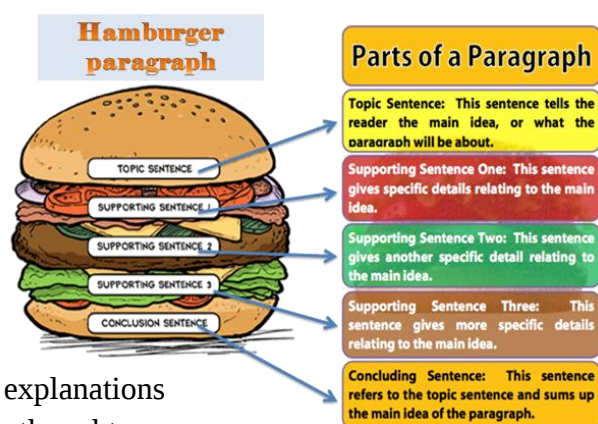
A paragraph is a group of sentences that talk about one main idea. It presents thoughts in a clear and organized way.

Features of a Good Paragraph:

- Unity – All sentences focus on one main idea
- Clarity – Easy to understand
- Logical Order – Ideas are arranged properly
- Completeness – Includes all necessary details

Structure of a Paragraph:

1. Topic Sentence – Introduces the main idea
2. Supporting Sentences – Provide details, examples, or explanations
3. Concluding Sentence – Summarizes or gives a closing thought



Types of Paragraphs:

- **Descriptive Paragraph:** Focuses on painting a picture with words.
- **Narrative Paragraph:** Tells a story or a sequence of events.
- **Expository Paragraph:** Explains a process or provides information/facts.
- **Persuasive Paragraph:** Aims to convince the reader of a specific opinion.

DESCRIPTIVE PARAGRAPH

A descriptive paragraph describes a person, place, object, or event using sensory details (what you see, hear, smell, feel, or taste). The goal of a **Descriptive Paragraph** is to help the reader "see" what you are describing.

Features of a Descriptive Paragraph

- Uses vivid adjectives
- Appeals to the five senses
- Creates a clear picture in the reader's mind
- Uses figurative language (similes, metaphors)
- Focuses on details and imagery



Format of a Descriptive Paragraph

1. Title/ Heading
2. Topic Sentence – Introduce what you are describing
3. Description (Body)
 - Appearance
 - Feelings
 - Sensory details
4. Conclusion – Final impression or personal feeling

SAMPLE DESCRIPTIVE PARAGRAPH
