Kitchen Safety – Spot the Hazard

I. 95% of all childhood burns and scalds happen at home in the kitchen.

Children's skin is much more delicate than adults, so burns can be more serious and life changing!

Sauce pans

Certain cupboards in the kitchen may contain harmful & poisonous chemicals, such as cleaning products. These should be kept in a high cupboard out of reach. If there is a child under 5 years old in your home, cupboard locks are advised.

Kettle Flex/wires/Extension

Ovens can stay hot even after they've been turned off. When these appliances are on children should stay out of the kitchen unless supervised by an adult.

Cluttered Floor

Cables should be pushed to the back of the worktop, so they are out of reach from small children to grab. This will also prevent anyone from tripping over them and having an accident. Cables should also be kept away from the sink or any areas where there is access to water.

Open cupboard storing

Turning the saucepan handles away from the edge of the counter or cooker and using the back rings keeps them out of reach of small children and ensures they can't be knocked over.

Oven

It is important that the floor space in the kitchen is kept clear from toys, clothes, books, etc. as this could cause someone to trip and fall leading to a burn or scald.

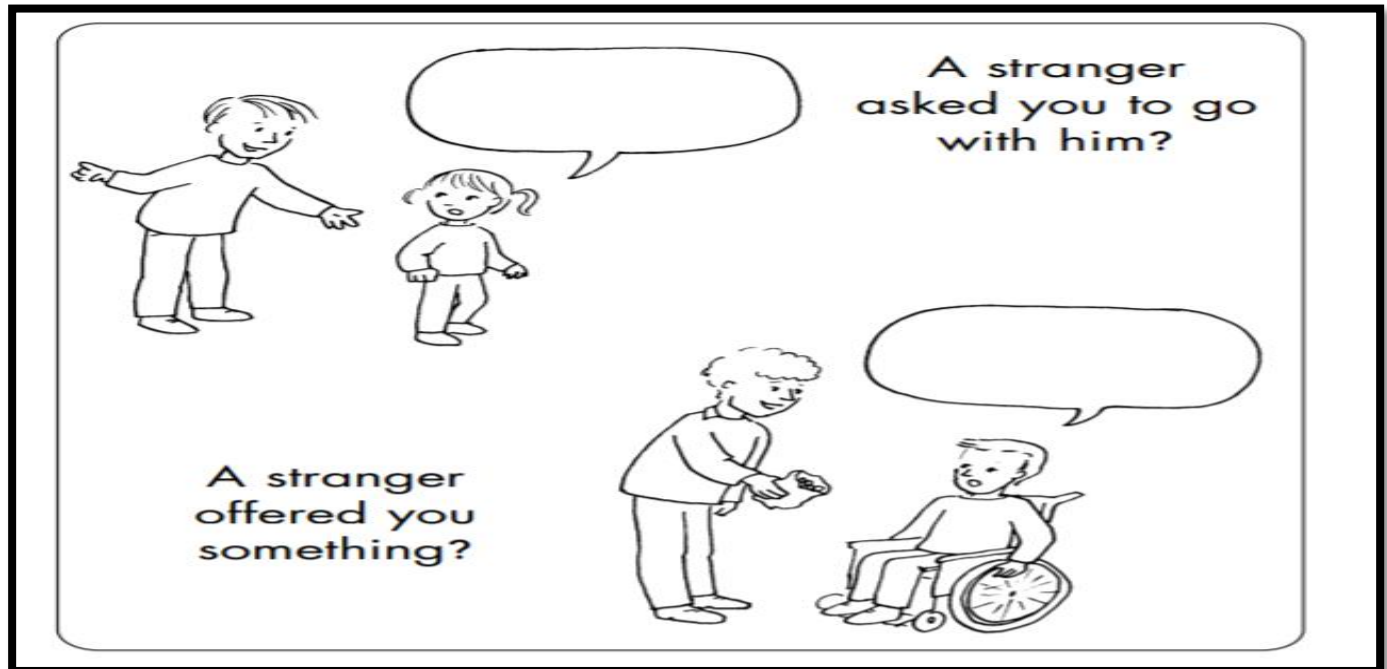

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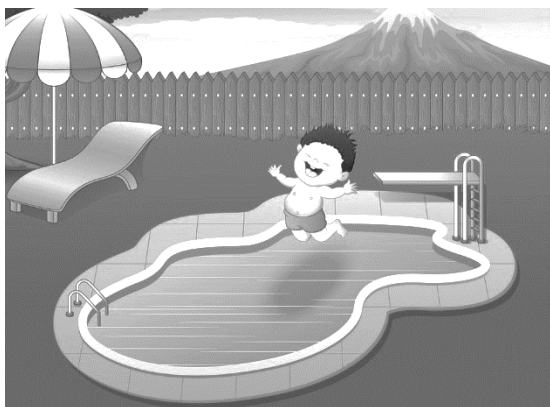
