SOLUTIONS FOR DESCRIPTIVE TYPE QUESTIONS

1. The process of developing a business plan, launching and running a business using innovation to meet customer needs and to make a profit is entrepreneurship.

2. Patience

Positivity

3. Switch from parts to wholes (& back again)

Identify parts that make up a whole and the connections between them.

See the layers – know where you are.

Divide conversations into layers to segment your thinking.

Think scale

Switch between zooming in to see the details and out to see the big picture.

Select based on criteria.

Prioritize and understand which parts and triggers are important in each situation.

Inject triggers into conversations.

A trigger is a detail (for example, a trend, technology, business model or outcome etc.) that can be injected to spark new ideas and speed up a conversation.

4. First, you want to provide references for sources that you have used in your writing because it is the ethical thing to do; it is not fair to use anyone else's words and/or ideas as if they were your own.

Second, by citing these sources, you are telling your audience that you have researched your topic, and you give the immediate impression of increased credibility.

5. **Introduction**: Start by expressing your general gratitude for the support you received.

Body: Mention specific individuals, teams, or organizations you wish to thank.

Conclusion: Summarize your gratitude or acknowledge any final individuals.

Keep it Concise: Write brief statements expressing your gratitude without unnecessary details.

Context Matters: Tailor your acknowledgment based on the context, whether it's for a project, thesis, or other formal documents.

6. A **mind map** is a visual tool used to represent information, ideas, or concepts in a hierarchical and interconnected way. It starts with a central idea or theme in the middle and branches out into related subtopics, concepts, or details.

A **questionnaire** is a written set of questions used to gather information, opinions, or feedback from a group of people. The questions can be open-ended (allowing respondents to answer in their own words) or closed-ended.

- 7. An acknowledgement of a reference is a way of expressing gratitude to someone who has helped you with your research or project.
 - It can be either a list or a more fluid paragraph, depending on your preference and style. You can write an acknowledgement of a reference by using a sentence starter, such as "I would like to thank" or "I am grateful to", followed by the name and title of the person or entity, followed by what you are thanking them.
- 8. Presentation techniques are the abilities and qualities necessary for creating and delivering a compelling presentation that effectively communicates information and ideas. They encompass what you say, how you structure it, and the materials you include to support what you say, such as slides, videos, or images.

Eg: A poster campaign to create awareness, an illustrated storybook on the subject to create awareness, a simple card or board game to create awareness.
