

They eat grass, fruits, small branches and barks of trees. Elephants are found in the grass lands of Africa and forests of Asia. They live in groups called herds. A baby elephant is called a calf.

Some more elephant facts:

- They sleep standing up.
- They cool off by fanning their ears.
- An adult elephant weighs up to 4000 kilograms.
- They need lots of space to roam about and eat.
