15	Write a brief note on Renewable resources. <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Renewable resources are resources which can be replaced or reproduced easily.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Sunlight, air and wind are resources that are continuously available and their quantity is not affected by human consumption.• Many renewable resources can be depleted by human use, but are replaced and the balance is maintained.• For example, agricultural crops, take a short time for renewal; others, like water, take a comparatively longer time, while still others, like forests, take even longer.
16	<p>What are the human made resources?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Natural substances become resources only when their original form has been changed.• Iron ore was not a resource until people learnt to extract iron from it.• People use natural resources to make buildings, bridges, roads, machinery and vehicles, that are known as human made resources, even the technology is defined as a human made resource.
