	POETIC DEVICES: DEFINITION & EXAMPLES:	
1.	Simile	A comparison using "like" or "as". Example: Her smile was as bright as the sun.
2.	Metaphor	A direct comparison without "like" or "as". Example: The sun is a golden ball.
3.	Alliteration	The repetition of the same consonant sound at the beginning of words. Example: Peter Piper picked a peck of pickled peppers.
4.	Personification	Giving human qualities to non-human things. Example: <i>The wind whispered through the trees</i> .
5.	Onomatopoeia	A word that imitates a sound. Example: <i>The bees buzzed in the garden</i> .
6.	Imagery	Words that create pictures in the reader's mind using sensory details. Example: The golden sun dipped below the calm, blue ocean.
7.	Assonance	The repetition of vowel sounds in nearby words. Example: <i>The rain in Spain stays mainly in the plain</i> .
8.	Rhyme Scheme	The pattern of rhymes at the end of lines in a poem. It is marked using letters (A, B, C, etc.). Example: The cat sat on a mat (A) It was friends with a big fat rat (A) They danced around all day (B) And happily ran away (B) (Rhyme Scheme: AABB)
9.	Rhyming Words	Words that have similar ending sounds. Example: <i>night – bright</i> , <i>fun – sun</i> , <i>cat – hat</i>
