**Conjunction** - A word that is used to join words, groups of words or sentences is called a Conjunction. They are also known as joining words or connecting words.

Some of the Conjunctions are:

- **so** – is used to show the result as in the sentence.

Eg. I was hungry **so** I ate fast.

- **if** – is used to show the condition.

Eg. Let me know **if** you go to the school.

- **until** – is used to show up to, but not after, a specific time i.e., to say how long a situation continues.

Eg. I read a book **until** my father came.

- **as** – is used to show that when one event happens while another is in progress.

Eg. The phone rang, **as** I was leaving.
