Adjectives of Number answers the question, 'How many?'

There are three kinds of Numeral Adjectives-

- 1. Definite Numeral Adjectives

- **1. Definite Numeral Adjectives** They are those which indicate an exact number.

Eg: one, two, three etc. - Cardinal, first, third, last etc. - Ordinal
